In General:

- JA(s) must believe in our Mission, Vision, and Goals
- Location: In the field; locations where JAs interact with other students
- Stipend/Pay Potential: Yes
- Time Commitment: Based on the JAs availability
- Skills Gained: Effective Communication, Public Relations, Marketing, Sales, Customer Service, Active Listening, at a minimum
- Requirements from the JAs:
 - Works independently
 - o Sign up new students to the Soft Skills Credential Program
 - Provides an update back to the CEO by the last Saturday of the month via text, phone, or email
- Benefits It's an opportunity for JAs to:
 - Apply the concepts you learned in the Soft Skills Training in real time interactions
 - Sharpen your people/soft skills
 - Share your personal training experience with other students you're in contact with on a regular basis
 - o Gain more experience to add to your resume
 - o Promote the value of the credential to your peers and other students
 - Earn money when you ask other students to signs up, complete the program, and take the assessment test
- About the Soft Skills Credential Program This program is a/an:
 - o 6-week program, typically
 - o After School Program
 - Saturday Enrichment Program
 - Asynchronous training program in which students can complete the self-directed, self-paced module online at anytime
- Other Information:
 - Training starts on Saturdays
 - o **Registration Fee to Students: \$499.00**; **\$450.00** (COVID-19 Price), meaning \$75/per week, paid in advance
 - Contact Soft Skill Zone to enroll new students
 - o Time: Training will be assigned to students by 1:00 p.m.
 - o Instructions to JA's: encourage students to complete one module per week, study during week five, and take to test during week six
 - o JA's Stipend: \$100 per student enrolled in the program to complete the training and take the assessment test
